I had no idea they were in there or I would have never gave them permission to search my car. I was taken into arrest and taken to the Columbia county jail. I would like to add that my mugshot was great with my eyelash hanging.

Q12: What law enforcement agency did you have contact with?

A12: Columbia County

Q13: Do you know who the arresting deputy was?

A13: I have no idea

Q14: Could it have been Deputy Vogel?

A14: I don't know. There were two cops there one of which was a Deforest police officer but I don't know the name

"I don't really think it matters. I've been through hell and back since I've started here. Being put on leave on May of last year. When the person who started the rumors was allowed to still work. Rumors continued to spread and also started [redacted] from a lieutenant. Also created retaliation. I gave in on Thanksgiving. Workers could tell how it affected me. I had [redacted] I called Parenteau, Lange, Fox and Admin Captain Schultz on one day regarding situations with this Lt.

I said that it was starting to affect me and then was placed on leave.

Prior to being placed on leave in that month my [redacted] in that month to help my [redacted] and my overall [redacted]

I did not want to tell anyone or disclose any information because it was absolutely embarrassing and shameful. My [redacted] convinced me to come forward with it because it was affecting me so deeply. I have never had anyone retaliate like that against me. I had never had an employer or co-workers give me such problems in any of my previous jobs or career.

After my last pre-disciplinary hearing where I was made to look like I was out gossiping I decided it was time to come forward with the rest of the information because I couldn't do it anymore. You can ask the interviewer. I don't remember her name. I think Sara Goodman. During the conversation I broke down into a million tears crying and gave her the details of everything that had happened. The days following that have been a [redacted]

In addition to having to speak about exactly what happened and give the details, being placed on Admin Leave without pay has put a bigger stress on me on top of it. To a point where [redacted]

The days following that continued to be a downward spiral, leading up to my arrest. My [redacted] is aware and has now [redacted]

[redacted] for me to try to [redacted] again. From everything that I had to go through and talk about.

It's very traumatic when you have a place of employment where you feel that you can't come and talk to anyone about any of it and it keeps going on. When you do try to talk to someone it is put out there as hearsay and gossip and spreading rumors.

After reporting the information about Lt. Marczewski I sat in my home for days awake. Scared to leave and scared that if he loses his job he is going to retaliate against me knowing where I live, and kill me and my children. I expressed this to CO Parenteau that I was scared. I am still fearful and scared of what is going to happen with all of this with him. To the point where I am trying to move because I am terrified."

CONTENT OF INTERVIEW – Interviews and notes are conducted in Question and Answer format.

Q1: Please describe your contact with Ms. Suprise on 02/27/21.

A1: My contact with Ms. Suprise occurred on Hwy 33 in Caledonia Township. Ashley was pulled over for a speeding violation and operating left of center on Hwy 33. During my contact, Ashley's behavior was excitable and erratic with large behavioral variations and mood swings. Ashley admitted to consuming alcohol in Reedsburg in the amount of "one beer." Consent was asked to search the vehicle due to Ashley's behavior and was granted. During this search, vape cartridges containing THC and an edible THC were found. Ashley was placed through Standardized Field Sobriety Testing and gave a Preliminary Breath Test Sample of .107. During my contact, both Deputy Stage and I agreed that we believed Ashley to be under the influence of alcohol as well as possibly some sort of stimulant based on her erratic behavior.

Q2: Please describe your reason for placing Ms. Suprise under arrest.

A2: During Standardized Field Sobriety Testing, I observed sufficient clues to indicate Ashley's ability to operate a motor vehicle was impaired. Ashley admitted that the edible THC in the driver's door was hers and that she knew it was there. Ashley was placed under arrest for OWI 1st and Possession of THC – Misdemeanor. When asked for consent for a blood test, Ashley asked me what would happen if she smoked THC "yesterday" and it showed up in a blood test. After explaining the process, Ashley declined to give an evidentiary chemical test of her blood. Ashley was transported to the Columbia County Jail. Ashley made questionable comments regarding [REDACTED] which were addressed through contact with [REDACTED]

Q3: Did Ms. Suprise mention her employment with the WIDOC and did she use it as an attempt to get out of trouble?

EXHIBIT 337

A3: Ashley first told Deputy Stage that she worked for CCI. I was not present during this conversation and I do not know in what context Ashley brought up her CCI employment. Ashley also told me that she worked for CCI as well as being a Private Investigator in Illinois. During the consent search, Ashley was having mood swings and stated she did not understand why she was being treated like a criminal and that she worked as a guard for CCI. Ashley told me that she was currently under investigation for assaulting an inmate and told me that the whole thing was "bullshit" and "not true." Other than these statements, Ashley did not use her employment as a means to get out of trouble to the best of my recollection.

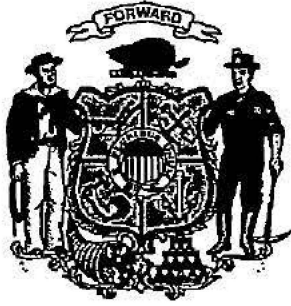

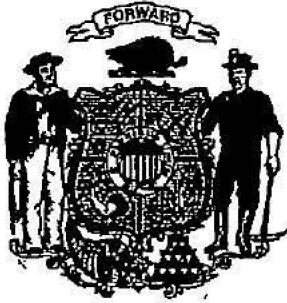
